Economy of the Central and Eastern European Countries

Detailed information

Theme and Objectives

The main objective of this lecture is to familiarize students with issues about the economic developments (successes and failures) of the Central and Eastern European Countries. The common feature of this group of countries is the historical background in the meaning of the economic transformation from centrally planned to market economy. Poland will be a special case study deeply analysed during the course. After the lecture Student shall have fundamental knowledge in the field of economic transformation and specific economic theories dealing with this process (both classical theories and heterodox ones). Student should recognize and understand differences between CEE countries and should know the relations and mechanisms influencing development of the CEEC with a special case of Poland.

Description and Schedule

Classification of the Central and Eastern European countries (21 countries from Russia and Estonia to Albania and Macedonia), new EU member states and countries out of the EU

Model of economic transformation of the CEEC (traditional and non-traditional analysis of transformation)

Determinants influencing economic development of these countries (social, geographical, cultural etc.)

Effects of economic transformation in the economic, social and technical areas Similarities and disparities between economic development of the CEEC Competitiveness of CEE economies – international indicators

Poland as a special case study of post-transformation economies
