<p>■授業のテーマと到達目標</p> <p>Title: Terrorism in a historical perspective Description: This course deals with the question of political violence in contemporary history, since the late XVIIIth century until 2015. This phenomenon structured European and global history from the French Revolution, and through the question of political violence, it's a history of political ideologies and radicalism. Students are invited to intervene with their own knowledge, to make comparisons with present and formulate substantiated personal views on the issues discussed.</p> <p>Objectives: - Gain essential information and insight in the development and dynamics of European history, - Gain essential information and insight in political history (political radicalism and ideological currents) under the angle of political violence and law. - Learn to think 'historically' and to assess development in their proper historical context - Learn to think 'globally': to situate a phenomenon in a web of global interactions</p>
<p>■授業の概要と計画</p> <p>Day 1 : introduction / definition of a historical approach of the phenomenon (how the historical context can explain an attack, and define a genealogy of political violence). Day 2 : Terrorism, a French tradition ? How the political violence hit France during the long XIXth century ? Day 3 : The ideologies of terrorism : from theory to practices (anarchism, nationalism, etc.) Day 4 : War and terrorism (The first world war, the Armenian genocide and consequences) : the instrumentalization of an attack. Day 5 : The weapon of the weak ? The question of State terrorism in European history. How totalitarianism emerged in societies and in laws. What is the life under terror ? Day 6 : counterterrorism in a historical perspective. History of the counterterrorism laws and practices from the origins. Day 7 : is there a future for terrorism ? Recent developments of a globalized phenomenon. Day 8 : Exam</p>
<p>■成績評価と基準</p> <p>Attendance and participation in class: 20 per cent Oral exercise : 30 per cent Oral exam: 50 per cent Students are expected to master and synthesize the basic information and to discuss a given, relevant issue. Exam questions are 'essayistic' and problem oriented.</p>
<p>■履修上の注意(準備学習・復習、関連科目情報等を含む)</p> <p>A basic knowledge of European modern history would be helpful. This can be obtained through general textbooks or overviews on European history such as by Eric Hobsbawm, Mark Mazower,... A specialized book as Matthew Carr (Unknown soldiers, Profile Books, 2006) would be helpful too.</p>
<p>■学生へのメッセージ</p> <p>Dear students, through the question of political violence, it is another history of Europe that I want to make. I understand that many of you may have only limited understanding of European history : this topic is a good way to discover this history (maybe the dark side of our political history). And don't be shy in class: I hope you'll speak out freely because I am convinced that the only way to "think" historically is to debate and compare.</p>
