■授業のテーマ

This is an introductory course focused on current developments in the field of Migrations issues in the European Union. Starting with the year 2015 Europe has come under unprecedented migratory pressure that put into question the very structure of the Common European Asylum System (CEAS). Migration through the Mediterranean has to be considered nowadays no more as an "emergency". In fact, according to the so-called Dublin regime the country of first entrance is responsible for carrying out the asylum procedure leaving it open how the burden that the granting of asylum involves should eventually be shared between the EU Member States. Both the 1951 United Nations Geneva Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees (GCR 1951) and the CEAS are built upon the implicit assumption that refugee protection should be of a temporary nature, but in reality, protection has most often become permanent.

The first urgency is always to save lives at sea. At present border surveillance and the fight against trafficking and smuggling of migrants seem to be the priorities in EU policy and action. The new models, in particular the Statement agreed with Turkey, do not convince from a legal point of view, mainly because refugees deserve a special attention, based on the non-refoulement principle. The time has come to exit the logic of emergency and formulate a lasting policy to manage migrations, implementing Lisbon Treaty and Fundamental Rights Charter's principles based on solidarity and respect of human rights, as well as on true cooperation among States.

The course will focus firstly on the description of EU Institutional framework, then Migration Policy will be treated, together with Human Rights and Law of the Sea issues, not forgetting a quick examination of the reasons for Migration and an overview on the Mediterranean.

■授業の到達目標

Students will obtain wide-ranged institutional knowledge about

- the evolution of European Union's Migration Policy
- the difficulties in the relationship among Member States as well as with third States involved (Libya, Turkey, etc.)
- some practical examples taken from recent practice

■授業の概要と計画

Lecture 1 – Introduction to European Union Institutional Framework and to EU Migration Policy How does EU work? Which are the rules and the practice of EU Migration Policy? How far are Member States still competent on this issue?

The Dublin System and its Reform; The Schengen System. FRONTEX Agency

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Lecture 2 – The reasons for Migration from Africa to Europe and the Corridors used.

Why do people move? How do they travel?

Migrants, refugees and asylum. The 1951 Geneva Convention on Refugees and the European Convention on Human Rights

Lecture 3 – An Introduction of Mediterranean: The Sea, the History, the Culture, the Geography, the Conflicts.

Search and Rescue in the Mediterranean. The Provisions in the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. The 1979 Hamburg Convention and the SOLAS 1974 Convention. Differences among EU Member States on their interpretation and application. The Practice after 'Mare Nostrum' and 'Triton' operations.

Lecture 4 – Future Scenarios: "Externalization" of a Problem: is the "Australian Solution" a possible one? The EU agreements with Turkey and with Libya.

A forgotten Migrant: "Environmental Refugees". How will we cope with them, who will represent the majority of Migrants in the future? Some proposals to overcome the distinction among Refugees and so-called "Economic Migrants" and to end the construction of the "Fortress Europe".

Session 5 - Final exam: oral examination

Note: Lecture 2, 3 and 4 are divided into two times (In total: 7 classes + exam).

Participation in discussions (30%) and final exam (70%)

Students will be mainly evaluated on the basis of their achievements in the exam. The exam questions will refer to the content of the lectures.
